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### Preface

HAVE YOU EVER TRIED to compare the prophetic passages in Matthew, Mark and Luke? Or to find the Lord's Prayer in more than one Gospel? Or to work out the sequence of events surrounding Jesus' birth or resurrection as related in the different Gospels? The purpose of *Parallel Gospels in Harmony* is to help you do that, and so to encourage the reading and study of God's inspired Word.

A disciple in the garden of Gethsemane cuts off the ear of the high priest's servant according to all four Gospels. But only John tells us the servant's name, and that it was Peter who wielded the sword. And only Luke tells us that Jesus healed the wound. This book allows you to see all of this at a glance.

Matthew, Mark and Luke all record Jesus' words concerning sin against the Holy Spirit, but only Mark explains that Jesus said this, "because..." (See page 76.) Three Gospels warn against "the yeast of the Pharisees," but only one of them explains what it is. (See page 108.) So, there is much that can be learned by reading the Gospels in parallel.

#### Why four Gospels?

Why do we have four inspired Gospels instead of just one? According to early Church writers, the Apostle Matthew wrote his account first in Hebrew, the language of the earliest disciples. Then Luke accompanied the Apostle Paul in his ministry to the Gentiles, and wrote his Gospel in Greek. Later Mark wrote what he remembered hearing at the Apostle Peter's feet. And finally the aged Apostle John wrote his account to further bless the Church. None of this was accidental, of course: we have four inspired Gospels because the divine Author of the Bible chose to record the life and teachings of Jesus Christ in this manner.

The four Gospels according to Matthew, Mark, Luke and John each present the life and teachings of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ from a different perspective. But it is one story. Mark's account is fast-moving, Matthew's emphasizes the fulfillment of prophecies from the Hebrew Scriptures,

Luke's speaks to a cosmopolitan Greek audience, and John's stresses a close, personal relationship with Jesus. But all four relate the same Gospel or "Good News."

#### Differences in the Gospel accounts

Why do the Gospels sometimes differ in the way they order the same or similar passages? And why do Gospel harmonies or parallel Gospels occasionally differ in the sequence they assign to certain passages? The main reason is that the Gospel writers themselves combine chronological presentations of events with topical arrangements of Jesus' teachings. They include occasional flashbacks (Compare Matt. 14:2, 3, 6.) and isolated anecdotes ("on another sabbath"—Luke 6:6; "on one of those days"—Luke 8:22, 20:1; "when he finished praying in a certain place"—Luke 11:1).

We can only assume that the Divine Author who inspired the Gospels chose, in his wisdom, to leave us with some uncertainty as to the exact order of events. Rather than be unsettled by this, I believe we should accept it in the spirit of Deuteronomy 29:29: "The secret things belong to Yahweh our God; but the things that are revealed belong to us and to our children forever, that we may do all the words of this law." Our job is not to puzzle out the things God has kept hidden from us, but rather to trust and obey.

#### Gospel harmonies and parallel Gospels

Some time around A.D. 170 a Christian writer named Tatian compiled his *Diatessaron*, a work merging the words of the four Gospels into a single narrative. Less than a century later Ammonius the Alexandrian produced a copy of the Gospel of Matthew with corresponding passages from the other Gospels arranged alongside—according to Eusebius, who went on to build on that work a more complex system of cross-references.

#### About this book, and its use of brackets []

The four Gospels are presented here in parallel columns, in roughly chronological order, with corresponding passages side by side. I have not aimed for innovation, but have simply built on the work of countless Bible readers and scholars down through the centuries who have written on the life of Christ and who have produced their own parallel Gospels or Gospel harmonies.

There are five main differences that set this work apart from others that have preceded it. (1) It uses the text of the World English Bible. (2) It is in the public domain, not copyrighted. (3) To preserve the flow of the Gospel message, it does not break up the material into pericopes or numbered selections. (4) It includes a Study Guide to facilitate personal study and group discussion. (5) It places in parallel, not only the events and sermons that Gospel harmonies usually group together, but also, in a few places, the sermons and events that bear a very close resemblance to each other although they appear to be different events. I have placed these inside brackets [like this].

For example, Luke tells of a meal at the home of a Pharisee, during which Jesus said, "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites!" and Matthew records the same words in a sermon Jesus gave to a large audience in Jerusalem. (Luke 11:44 and Matt. 23:27) I have placed these accounts on pages 140 and 196 in what appears to be their proper places chronologically, but have also placed the similar words in parallel columns, with the out-of-sequence passage inside brackets.

During the course of his earthly ministry, Jesus visited many towns and cities in Galilee, Judea, Samaria and the surrounding area, so it is reasonable to assume he repeated the same thoughts and even the same sermons to different audiences. What, then, about the Sermon on the Mount? Matthew presents it as a single unified discourse (Matt. 5:1-7:29), whereas Luke records many of the same words as sayings of Jesus scattered throughout chapters 6, 11, 12, 14 and 16. For example, Matthew and Luke both present the Lord's Prayer (Matt. 6:9-13 and Luke 11:2-4), Matthew as part of the Sermon on the Mount, and Luke "when he finished praying in a certain place" and the disciples asked Jesus to teach them how to pray. (Luke 11:1) Does Luke actually quote from the Sermon on the Mount here and in his other examples of Jesus' sayings? Or, does his Gospel refer to other occasions when Jesus spoke the same words to different audiences? We can't really know for sure.

Unless the context dictates otherwise, I have placed these passages in parallel to aid comparison. And when the context does point to clearly different occasions when Jesus used the same words, I have again kept them in their context, but also repeated them in brackets [like this] next to the parallel passage.

Where selected notes from the World English Bible are included, they are at the bottom of the column of text they pertain to. My own comments appear as headings at the top of each page and as explanatory notes at the bottom of certain pages, beneath the table of parallel columns. However, notes and comments are kept to a minimum, to avoid distracting from the Gospel message itself.

Rather than copyright this book, I have chosen to follow the example of the creators of the World English Bible by placing *Parallel Gospels in Harmony: with Study Guide* in the public domain, so that anyone who wishes may freely copy it, reproduce it, reprint it or translate it, without any obligation to pay royalties or even to ask permission.

Jesus conversed on a daily basis with His disciples and spoke repeatedly to crowds in many villages, towns and cities. He, no doubt, repeated the same thoughts to different audiences, often giving essentially the same sermon. His pronouncing woe on the Pharisees as Matthew describes here seems to be an occasion different from Luke 11. Similar passages from Luke are placed in parallel here to aid comparison, but are in brackets to indicate that it was likely a different occasion. See also the context of Luke 11 on page 140.

The three synoptic Gospels tell us that darkness occurred from the sixth hour to the ninth. (Matthew 27:45, Mark 15:33, Luke 23:44). To understand these references, it may be helpful to compare Matthew 20:1-12 where some day laborers were hired early in the morning, others at the third hour (around 9 a.m.), the sixth hour (noon), the ninth hour (3 p.m.) and the eleventh hour (5 p.m.), and those hired at the eleventh hour are said to have worked only one hour when paid in the evening, shortly after 6 p.m.. This makes the hours understandable, but we are still left with a problem because John 19:14 says it was "about the sixth hour" when Pilate told the Jews, "Behold, your King!" and Mark 15:25 says it was "the third hour" when Jesus was crucified. Commentators have taken a variety of approaches to work out this

seeming discrepancy. Some suggest that a copyist's error may have mistakenly replaced one Greek numeral with another in an early manuscript. Others postulate that John measured time according to the Roman civil day, counting from midnight instead of from dawn, so that his sixth hour was 6 a.m. (Compare John 1:39.) Still others argue that the third, sixth and ninth hours were not precise times, but rather these were colloquial expressions referring to approximate quarters of the day, allowing for some overlapping, with the third and sixth hours both being used to refer to the time around noon. And some commentators suggest that Pilate sent Jesus off to be crucified at the sixth hour, around noon, but that Jesus was kept in prison overnight until the sentence was carried out the next day.

### The Acts of the Apostles

- 1:1 The first book I wrote, Theophilus, concerned all that Jesus began both to do and to teach, 1:2 until the day in which he was received up, after he had given commandment through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. 1:3 To these he also showed himself alive after he suffered, by many proofs, appearing to them over a period of forty days, and speaking about God's Kingdom. 1:4 Being assembled together with them, he commanded them, "Don't depart from Jerusalem, but wait for the promise of the Father, which you heard from me. 1:5 For John indeed baptized in water, but you will be baptized in the Holy Spirit not many days from now."
- 1:6 Therefore when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, are you now restoring the kingdom to Israel?"
- 1:7 He said to them, "It isn't for you to know times or seasons which the Father has set within his own authority. 1:8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you. You will be witnesses to me in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the uttermost parts of the earth."
- 1:9 When he had said these things, as they were looking, he was taken up, and a cloud received him out of their sight. 1:10 While they were looking steadfastly into the sky as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white clothing, 1:11 who also said, "You men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into the sky? This Jesus, who was received up from you into the sky will come back in the same way as you saw him going into the sky."
